




Proficiency Levels Defined

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Proficiency Sublevel Differences

Differences between low and mid is the in <u>quantity and quality</u> with the same function. Mid can do same things but with more variety (vocab./grammar) and less mistakes.

Differences between mid and high is not being able to <u>sustain</u> criteria

Peaks and Lows of Proficiency

Students might spike into the next proficiency level

They are unable to sustain it and return to the lower proficiency level
