Guidelines for Prescribed Special Procedures

In the event that a student requires a prescribed treatment or procedure during the school day, individual arrangements will be made through the campus nurse. The request for such a treatment or procedure must meet the following guidelines:

The student must have the treatment or procedure during school hours and cannot otherwise be scheduled outside of school hours.

A current written request must be submitted annually by the parent/guardian and by a local prescribing physician. Nurses employed by the District may accept orders only from those physicians who are legally authorized to practice medicine in Texas by the Texas Board of Medical Examiners (M.D., D.O., podiatrist or dentist) or other health-care professionals with authority to write prescriptions (advanced practice nurse, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant).
